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This report summaries the business that has been concluded on behalf of the CCG during June, July and August.

As part of my local work I continue to chair the City-wide Locality Group (CLG) where updates have been received around Learning Disability, Extended Access, Urgent Care and Neighbourhood maturity, Primary Care Mental Health service, Primary Care Estates and Workforce.

As reported in my May report, due to the General Election, the Health and Wellbeing Board, which was due to take place in June, was cancelled and reconvened on the 27 July. The first two meetings of the Accountable Care Partnership Board have now taken place. Councillor Cate McDonald and I will co-chair these meetings going forward.

An advert has been circulated for the position of Programme Director – Sheffield Accountable Care Partnership (ACP) and it is anticipated interviews will be held early October.

Joint Overview and Scrutiny Committee

I, along with the Accountable Officer, recently attended the Joint Overview and Scrutiny Committee where an update was provided on children's non specialised surgery and anaesthesia and hyper acute stroke.

Protected Learning/Training

A Protected Learning event was held over the Summer on the Prevention of Suicide. This was well attended by GPs and Practice Nurses. During July a training event was held for GPs to highlight the Prevent agenda.

Commissioners Working Together

On 28 June, the joint committee of clinical commissioning groups made the decision to change the way some children's surgery and anaesthesia services are provided in South and Mid Yorkshire, Bassetlaw and North Derbyshire.

Over the last three years, clinical commissioners and hospital trusts providing services in Barnsley, Bassetlaw, Chesterfield, Doncaster, Rotherham and Sheffield have come together to review and improve the care and experiences of all children needing an emergency operation in our region. By working together better across all hospitals and commissioning organisations, new ways of working have been developed which means the number of children affected by these changes has reduced since the launch of the consultation in October 2016 and gives staff working in the services more opportunities to improve and enhance their skills.

Around one or two children per week needing an emergency operation for a small number of conditions, at night or at a weekend, will no longer be treated in hospitals in Barnsley, Chesterfield and Rotherham and will instead have their surgery at Doncaster Royal Infirmary, Sheffield Children's Hospital or Pinderfield's General Hospital where the right staff, with the right skills, will be available 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

We expect the changes to be in place in the new year.

South Yorkshire and Bassetlaw Accountable Care System

Also in June, South Yorkshire and Bassetlaw Sustainability and Transformation Partnership (STP) was named as one of the first areas in the country to become an Accountable Care System and as such, we are bringing all of our local health and care partners together with both staff and citizens to plan the next generation of health and care services in our region.

Instead of many separate organisations all being responsible for individual health and care services, we will work together better, with the single aim of giving everyone in South Yorkshire and Bassetlaw a great start in life, with support to stay healthy and live longer - with increased life chances and opportunities for the wellbeing of every person, not just their physical healthcare needs.

There will be opportunities for staff and members of the public to help shape the developing ACS and our services later in the Summer. Full details will be available on the Commissioners Working Together website (<u>www.smybndccgs.nhs.uk</u>).

2016/17 Annual Improvement Assurance Framework (IAF) Assessment

The CCG's Annual IAF Assessment was held at the end of July where a number of areas were discussed. These included the Accountable Care Partnership Board, STP/ACS Development, Delivery, including primary care streaming, delayed transfers of care, GP Access, Activity and Quality, Innovation, Productivity and Prevention (QIPP), Cancer Waiting Times and Transforming Care. The CCG was congratulated on achieving a year-end assessment of Good which was an improvement on the previous year's rating and a reflection of all the hard work over the year.

GP Workforce Expert Consultation

In June I attended the above event which aimed to identify and shape strategies for retaining the GP workforce over the coming years.

NHS Clinical Commissioners (NHSCC)

I would like to inform you that I have been elected to commence a second term of office on the Board of NHS Clinical Commissioners and recently attended the NHS Clinical Commissioners Board in London. Key areas for discussion via Clinical Commissioners over the summer have included a response to the Care Quality Commission (CQC) regulation consultation, a roundtable debate on low priority items for NHS funding and more places for medical students.

Core Cities

In my role as Chair of the Core Cities, I attended a meeting in Birmingham in July. This meeting focussed on health inequalities where Birmingham Cross City CCG presented a case study.

NHS Confederation

The Accountable Officer and I attended the NHS Confederation in June. The Confederation brought together over 1,000 senior leaders from the health and social care sector where the outcome of the election and what it means for the NHS, its workforce, the transformation agenda and the health and care sector were discussed.

Recruitment

I am pleased to report that, subject to references, we have appointed Mr Tony Williams to the position of Lay Member, Systems and Development.
