1.1 Commissioning Executive Team (CET)

1.2 Planning and Delivery Group (P&DG)

- P&DG scrutinised the CCG Business Plan 2013/14 (Q3), discussing all objectives rated amber or red in advance of Governing Body
- P&DG discussed the individual services previously developed under practice-based commissioning/locality incentives and that were not part of local enhanced service arrangements
- Agreement reached in principle to support a move to e-referrals ahead of the national timescale
- P&DG agreed that Darnall Wellbeing service would continue to use the Darnall LIFT premises for a further year, with a request for outcome based evaluation of the service from the Clover Group
- P&DG agreed in principle to explore a pilot Speciality Training (ST4) training year
