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This report summaries the business that I have conducted on behalf of the CCG during January.

During the month I attended the launch of the Fair City Campaign and a meeting of the Public Sector Reform (PSTN) Leadership where the City Outcomes for Sheffield were agreed as follows and feedback will be received at the next PSTN meeting:-

- We have a strong, innovative and competitive economy that is successful nationally and internationally
- We live in high quality homes and neighbourhoods that are enjoyed by cohesive communities
- We are happy and thriving people who are confident in our life choices and are empowered to be responsible, independent citizens
- We live in a city that is easy to get to, easy to get around and has the infrastructure a big city needs
- We value and enjoy a unique natural environment that is cared for and accessible to all
- Our lives are safe from crime, disorder and risk
- We live long, healthy lives in a city where everyone can get the help and support they need
- Our city is a place where people want to live and visit, a place that is renowned for its high quality design, creativity, culture, sport and leisure
- We live in a city that runs reliably and affordably with the minimum negative impact
- We are highly educated, skilled and prosperous people who contribute to and share in the city's success

Two reports have recently been published '*Centre for Cities – City Outlook Report for 2015*' and '*State of Sheffield 2015*' both which will be discussed at the State of Sheffield launch on 27 February 2015.

As part of my national work, I attended a meeting of the NHS Clinical Commissioners (NHSCC) Board where Board members met with a range of key stakeholders with NHS England, NHS Improving Quality (NHS IQ), National Institute for Health and Care Excellence (NICE) and the Local Government Association (LGA) to engage on key pieces of work that are being undertaken and ensure that the commissioner voice is influencing their direction of travel.

At the time of writing, I am due to attend a meeting with senior Clinical Leaders and Nick Seddon, Special Advisor to the Prime Minister.

A meeting of the Health and Wellbeing Board with providers is due to be held at the end of the month and items for discussion will include the challenge facing the health and social care system, aspirations of the integrated commissioning programme,

NHS England Forward View, Devolution, Prime Minister's Challenge bid, current thinking about service models and development of the Provider Assembly.

A Right First Time Programme Board is also scheduled to take place at the end of the month.

A proposal around the Governing Body OD programme for 2015/16 has been developed and a paper is being presented today for discussion.

The recruitment process for the new Accountable Officer has begun and interviews will be held in early March.
