## **Accountable Officer's Report**

### **Governing Body meeting**

**1 December 2016**

#### **Perfect Patient Pathway visit**

Professor Sir Malcom Grant, Chair of NHS England, visited Sheffield's Perfect Pathway Test Bed programme at the end of October.

The Perfect Patient Pathway focuses on using new technology and ways of care to support the management of long term conditions. As described in the separate paper presented to the Governing Body, the aim is to keep people with these conditions well, independent and avoid crisis points which often result in hospital admission, intensive rehabilitation and a high level of social care support. This is a collaboration across the system, which is being tested in Sheffield with a view to rolling out across the wider STP footprint.

Professor Grant praised the rapid progress being made and how Sheffield has created an environment in which exciting new technologies can be developed and trialled.

#### **Sustainability and Transformation Plan**

The draft Sustainability and Transformation Plan for South Yorkshire and Bassetlaw was submitted to NHS England on the 21 October 2016 and was made public on 11 November. #### **Appointment of Deputy Chief Nurse**

I am pleased to announce that Mandy Philbin has been appointment to the post of Deputy Chief Nurse. Mandy is currently the Transformation Programme Lead for the Working Together Programme and will start in her new role in the New Year.

#### **Urgent and Emergency Care**

As co-lead for the urgent emergency care workstream with Louise Barnett, Chief Executive at Rotherham NHS Foundation Trust, we have started a series of meetings with the health economies in the STP. These meetings are to help us to share the ambitions of the STP whilst understanding the shape of urgent and emergency care in each health system. We have already identified a number of innovations and some interesting developments which we will share to spread the learning.

#### **Shaping Sheffield event**

The Shaping Sheffield event that was originally planned for 15 December has been moved to the 9 March to allow us to effectively progress the actions from the last meeting. The meeting in March will be used to discuss progress and to help each other tackle some of the challenges we face.

### **Respiratory Protected Learning Event**

The latest protected learning event was held in October and focused on respiratory disease. It covered diagnosis techniques on severity of exacerbation, care planning tools, the psychological and emotional issues affecting respiratory patients and an overview of the community services and self- management approaches available to help support patients. This was both well-attended and well-received by primary care staff.

### **A&E Learning Event**

On behalf of the Northern region A&E Improvement Programme, I was asked to help to facilitate an A&E Masterclass on System Wide Partnership. This provided an opportunity to look at good practice and share learning across the region and was a really positive event and well-attended event.

### **Health and Well Being Board**

I attended the Health and Wellbeing Board in October where the main topics of discussion were the Best Start Programme, health disability and employment in Sheffield and fuel poverty and cold-related illness.

### **Event in London on Emerging models of primary care**

Katrina Cleary and I attended the above event in London, which provided an opportunity for health care professionals to discuss how they can lead the development of new models of primary care that will improve care for our local populations.

### **KPMG Senior Women's Networking event**

I was asked to speak at KPMG's recent women's networking event, which featured four women at different stages of their careers talking about their roles and career path. This brought together senior women leaders from both the public and private sectors across the city and was a lively and interactive session that really celebrated the many talented women we have working in Sheffield.
