GPFV requires resources both CCG and primary care infrastructure to deliver the GP transformation agenda over the next 5 years. NHSE are currently recruiting to a transformation team, as yet it is not clear how this will support the CCGs work programme.

Recommendations

The Governing Body is asked to consider and note the update on the GP Forward View to NHS England.

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1. Introduction / Background

The Five Year Forward View (FYFV) recognised that primary care has been underfunded compared to secondary care and that this must change. The FYFV acknowledged that an increase in funding by 2020 was required to sustain and accelerate growth in primary care (Five Year Forward View, NHS England October 2014). The GP Forward View (GPFV) sets out the key funding and infrastructure elements of how this will be achieved in order to support GP practices and transform it to be developed, fit for a modern sustainable general practice (General Practice Forward View, NHS England April 2016).

Each CCG was asked to respond to the GPFV setting out the GPFV transformation plans for their area. The NHS Sheffield CCG Primary Care Team has written a response to the GPFV which was submitted to NHS England (NHSE), on behalf of the CCG via the Primary Care Commissioning Committee, on 23 December 2016 along with the Operational Plan. This paper provides Governing Body with an update on progress since then.

2. Our Strategic Plans

NHS Sheffield CCG has worked with key providers in the city to develop the Sheffield Placed Based Plan. The plan for Sheffield is in bringing the city together to work differently in delivering the mission, vision and aims in order to make significant change that is not possible for any one partner to achieve alone.

We have a strong track record of working together on transformational programmes of work in Sheffield but, as is common everywhere, there is no record of significant impact on stemming growth or managing demand.

This Sheffield Placed Based plan brings together the transformation needs from health and care, from education, from employment and from wider partners. Drawing together Sheffield's collective energy to shape and transform for a sustainable future.

The plan sets out:

- **Memorandum of Understanding** to transform the way we provide services across organisational boundaries
- Manage our resources as a **single account for the city**; every decision in the best interest of the city not individual organisations
- **Financial Strategy** that underpins the transformation
- **Stronger Together**: agree a set of principles and behaviors that develop us as system leaders working together to do the best for Sheffield and to unlock solutions that we cannot do when thinking only of individual organisations

3. GPFV Response

Sheffield CCG's GPFV submission strongly supports key priorities set out in based our Primary Care Strategy, and therefore our wider out of hospital strategic approach. It identifies how we intend to invest resources once confirmed from NHSE England to transform our GP practices in Sheffield to achieve the future proofing required. GP practices needs to be supported with resources to create a platform of sustained general practice that can adapt to the challenges set out strategically.

The Primary Care Commissioning Committee (PCCC) was consulted throughout the GPFV submission process and supported the development of the GPFV. The two drafts that were previously submitted to NHSE at various stages of the submission process were consulted on not only by PCCC but a number of other organisations including directly with general practice in Sheffield.

The high level implementation plan (Appendix 1 of GPFV submission) was submitted alongside the GPFV response and this will feed into the development of a detailed primary care work programme for the primary care team. Accountability and delivery of the primary care work programme will be through PCCC.

This programme of work will determine how we will deliver the priorities of the GPFV to support general practice transformation.

3.1 Feedback from NHS England

We have recently received feedback from NHSE on our submission, which was assessed against a 26 point framework. The Sheffield GPFV plan has been given a GREEN with positive feedback on the strength and ambition of the plan.

Four of the 26 areas require further clarity from us to give the assurance to NHSE by way of an addendum to the submission. The primary care team is currently working through the additional information required.

3.2 Next steps

The tight deadline set in regard to the plan's submission meant that we could not engage as widely as we would have liked. The primary care team, including locality managers, are engaging widely in developing a detailed implementation plan, although it should be noted it is still unclear as to how much further resource will be made available to fund key proposals. Further discussions will take place at the City-wide Locality Group and directly working through the localities and GP practices and at educational and training events, with updates on progress being received by PCCC.

4. Recommendations

The Governing Body is asked to consider and note the update on the GPFV submission to NHS England.
