Shadow Integrated Care System CEO Report

SOUTH YORKSHIRE AND BASSETLAW SHADOW INTEGRATED CARE SYSTEM

1. Purpose

This monthly paper from the sICS CEO provides an:

2. Report – April 2018

2.1 Planning Guidance

We continue to negotiate with NHS England and NHS Improvement on the application of the planning guidance 'Refreshing NHS Plans for 2018/19' in order to maximise the benefits of being designated as a shadow Integrated Care System for 2018/19.

2.2 National ICS Leads meeting – March 2018

A national ICS leads development day took place on 13 March, with topics discussed including local system planning and development, updates on the commissioner and provider sustainability funding schemes, population health management dashboards and engagement and accountability.

2.3 Visit to Manchester ICS

The core teams from Manchester and South Yorkshire and Bassetlaw ICSs met in March to further explore learning and to share thinking. Areas discussed included governance, oversight and assurance frameworks, and approaches to the planning guidance.

The informative and helpful session was chaired by Chris Ham, Chief Executive from the King's Fund and Michael Macdonnell, National Director for Health System Transformation at NHS England joined the discussions.

2.4 North of England ICS/STP leaders meeting

Leads from the North of England joined Richard Barker, Regional Director for NHS England (North) and Regional Winter Director, Warren Brown for NHS Improvement on 5 April. The session focused on discussions on ICS developments and system control totals, as well as an update on plans for joint working between NHSE and NHSI.

2.5 Hospital Services Review update

The Hospital Services Review report is now in its final development stages, following recent final rounds of engagement with clinicians and the public.

The formal publication date for the report is Tuesday 8 May, with communications planned in advance to raise awareness of the headlines with staff, stakeholders and those people who have been involved in ongoing engagement around the review.

A communications plan is in development and will follow a similar approach to the launch of the Hospital Services Review.

2.6 Capital bids to NHS England – first stage

We have submitted an outline of the potential capital bid to NHS England as part of a £1.6b pot available nationally. It includes bids for primary care, transformation and potential reconfiguration of services as well as backlog maintenance. Bids will be assessed against six criteria:

- Deliverability
- Patient benefit and demand management
- Service need and transformation
- Financial sustainability
- Value for money
- Strength of estates strategy

Business cases will be worked up and prioritised prior to submitting our final bids by the national deadline of 16 July.

2.7 ICS governance

To date, SYB sICS governance has worked within programme governance. The Oversight and Assurance Group, Collaborative Partnership Board, Executive Steering Group and programme boards have served us well and we will continue to use these as we review our governance over the next three months.

Our approach will be to simplify and use statutory governance arrangements in our organisations, place and system; a reflection of what advanced systems are doing. Draft proposals of how we might do this, using the Committee in Common (CiC) and Joint Committee of Clinical Commissioning Groups (JCCCG), will be explored in more detail at the Chief Executive and Accountable Officer workshop next week.

2.8 Visit by Professor Don Berwick

Professor Don Berwick joined clinicians from across South Yorkshire and Bassetlaw on Tuesday March 13 as part of his work with the King's fund to support developments in the leading accountable care systems.

Don heard from a range of clinical leaders in South Yorkshire and Bassetlaw who have been and are involved in some of the transformation work across the region and shared his learning with them.
