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#### **1. Introduction**

NHS Sheffield CCG's Constitution sets out within its Standing Orders (Section 3 Meetings of the CCG and CCG's Governing Body paragraph 3.3 Petitions) that:

"Where a petition has been received by the CCG, the Chair shall include the petition as an item for the agenda of the next meeting of the Governing Body."

Governing Body, therefore, needs to formally note the receipt of the petition.

#### **2. Petitions Received**

Further to previous petitions received, an additional petition containing 3,430 signatures was presented to the Primary Care Commissioning Committee on 20 September 2018 by Mr Michael Suter, on behalf of Sheffield Save our NHS, regarding the consultation 'Making Urgent Care Work Better in Sheffield' as set out below:

"We the undersigned petition Sheffield Clinical Commissioning Group to withdraw its proposals to close the Minor Injuries Unit at the Royal Hallamshire Hospital and to close the Walk-in Centre on Broad Lane. We reject the assumption that the Northern General is an accessible or acceptable alternative for people in other parts of Sheffield. We have seen no clear proposals about other suggested locations for urgent care of any evidence that they would work in practice."

Members are asked to note that at the time this additional petition was presented, the formal consultation process had been completed and therefore the petition would not formally be included as part of the feedback.
