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This report summarise the business that has been concluded on behalf of the CCG during September/October 2019.

As this is my first report as Chair I would like to take the opportunity to formally thank Governing Body members for their support during my first two months in post.

During this initial period, I have begun and continue to meet with Governing Body members to discuss their objectives for the coming year. I have also met with some of our key partners to discuss the CCG's strategy and vision going forward.

In my role as West Locality GP, I attended a West Executive Organisational time out session. This was a productive session where the following was discussed:-

1. Recognised the strengths of the NHS Sheffield CCG West Locality Executive Team and the progress made over the last twelve months;
2. Identified the opportunities and challenges facing the West Locality / Primary Care Networks over next twelve months;
3. Captured the actions resulting from the content discussed and agreed – focus / priorities moving forward / who will do what / when

On 17 September 2019, I jointly chaired the Joint Committee Development session with Cllr George Lindars-Hammond, Sheffield City Council where the system response to Ageing Well, Mental Health and SEND was discussed.

I also attended my first public Joint Clinical Commissioning Committee meeting where the main topic for discussion was the Hospital Services Programme.

## **Members' Council – 17 October 2019**

The CCG's Members' Council was held on the 17 October 2019. All practices were invited to attend. I was asked to present the priorities for the CCG and participants were invited to visit a Primary Care Café where they could learn more about the development of Children's Community Services, the City Wide Election for GPs, Digital Presence and Member interface, Health Inequalities, Safeguarding, Patient Experience, the emerging Primary Care Mental Health Services. They were also given the opportunity to discuss the development of the CCG's Strategy. The workshops were very well received.

### **Urgent Care Review**

Until becoming Chair of the CCG, one of my roles was clinical lead for the Urgent Care review. I met many people and partners from Sheffield in the workshops and groups we held to clarify the key problems with urgent care and how to address those problems. Thank you to everyone for their input.

In August and September, we took those proposals to the Accountable Care Partnerships, which we are part of, given that a system wide response to addressing the problems will help address the problems. The Partnership recognise the problems and agreed to the approach developed. They will now be taking forward the work to address the problems by first improving knowledge and information for staff and the public and improving urgent care pathways. This was endorsed at our Primary Care Commissioning Committee in September.

The work will start with a stronger winter campaign, across a number of digital and traditional platforms, which will educate public and staff on when to use urgent care services and how to access them. The campaign will be delivered in partnership with the other health and care organisations in Sheffield and will follow the national NHS England campaign calendar but will be tailored to Sheffield audiences. This campaign will be followed by targeted work in communities we know, don't utilise the range of urgent care services on offer in Sheffield.

### **Mental Health Services in South Yorkshire and Bassetlaw**

I would like to highlight that South Yorkshire and Bassetlaw Integrated Care System (ICS) has been awarded an additional £2.5m investment, to bring mental health services in Sheffield closer to people's homes and better join up mental health support services.

The ICS, with partners Sheffield Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG), Sheffield Health and Social Care Trust, Primary Care Sheffield, Sheffield MIND and Sheffield City Council, put in a bid for the funding to put mental health services into Sheffield neighbourhoods, closer to where people live and more aligned to their GP practices which has been successful.

### **South Yorkshire and Bassetlaw Integrated Care System**

## **City Wide GP Election**

I am delighted to announce that we have appointed 4 GP's to the Governing Body for a period of three years. Our city wide elected representatives will be: Dr Marion Sloan, Dr Leigh Sorsbie, Dr Nikki Bates and Dr Lisa Philip.

## **Secondary Care Doctor**

Following the resignation of Dr Chris Whales as Secondary Care Doctor, the recruitment process for his replacement is currently underway. Deadline for applications is 4 November.
