#### **1. Introduction**

In usual circumstances the Primary Care Commissioning Committee (PCCC) meets formally on a bi-monthly basis. In response to the COVID-19 pandemic the March and May meetings in public were cancelled, however, a meeting in public was held in July 2020.

#### **2. Key Messages**

##### **23 January 2020**

2.1 The Committee considered the progress made towards developing a programme business case for the South Yorkshire and Bassetlaw for Wave 4 Allocations and the Sheffield strategic outline cases within that and were reassured that the capacity and capability to manage s programme of this scale is being addressed. The Committee noted that this programme links to the broader strategic ambition and the integration and transformation across the City.

##### **23 July 2020**

2.2 The Committee approved the merger of Meadow Green Health Centre and The Avenue Practice and asked that further work is undertaken to understand patient experience following the merger and respond to any issued identified.

2.3 The Committee received a report on risk assessment for black, Asian and minority ethnic, and other at risk staff. They were assured that risk assessments in primary care would be completed by the end of July 2020.

2.4 The Committee considered that the COVID-19 response in primary care, in particular noting the financial position and additional clarification that is awaited on further financial support and the requirements set out in the '*Second phase of General Practice response to COVID-19 – update to GP contracts and income protection arrangements*' and a report will be brought to the next PCCC meeting.
