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1. Introduction

The Primary Care Commissioning Committee (PCCC) met in public on 18 March 2021. The Committee agreed key messages to be noted by Governing Body.

2. Key Messages

Merger of Abbey Lane Surgery and Totley Rise Medical Practice

PCCC approved an application for the merger of Abbey Lane Surgery with Totley Rise Medical Practice. Both contracts are held by the same single handed GP.

The Committee noted that the change largely related to management functions and heard that the practice Patient Participation Groups were supportive of the change.

The practice have agreed to continue to review and measure the impact of change, working with the Quality and Engagement teams to further mitigate against these post-merger.

From 1 April 2021 the new practice will be known as the Beauchief Practice.

3. Recommendation
