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This report outlines the activity I have undertaken on behalf of Sheffield CCG during January and February 2022, along with highlights of key topics from the CCG.

Change and Transition Board

I have continued to Chair the Change and Transition Board on behalf of all South Yorkshire and Bassetlaw CCGs to ensure the due diligence of CCGs ahead of the establishment of the statutory Integrated Care Boards. In light of the delay to legislation, in February we took the opportunity to have a deep dive on the transition progress to date and identify areas of focus of the coming months.

Covid Response and Primary Care Networks (PCNs)

I continue to meet with Primary Care Network (PCN) Clinical Directors, alongside our Accountable Officer, Medical Director, Chief Nurse and other senior members of CCG staff with regard to the covid vaccination programme. We have helpfully used this time to discuss our future role in supporting the development of PCNs and the role PCN Clinical Directors can play in the emerging integrated care landscape in Sheffield and across South Yorkshire.

Sheffield Health and Care Partnership Board

Governing Body have been sighted on the work I have undertaken to compile a presentation for the Sheffield Health and Care Partnership Board to aid the understanding for the Integrated Care Board (ICB) Designate Leaders of the ambition, vision and partnership governance arrangements we have in place in Sheffield. This was presented at the Sheffield Health and Care Partnership Board in February and was positively received. Further work will now be undertaken with ICB colleagues to explore future operating models for 'place' in Sheffield and the public, staff and partnership engagement required.

Preparation for the South Yorkshire Integrated Care Board

I attended the last Integrated Care System Health Executive Group held in February. The meetings will be used for system development time in future. I have also attended two all staff webinars with the ICB's Designate Chief Executive Officer, which are open to all CCG staff – I would encourage all Sheffield CCG staff to take the opportunity to join the webinars to hear about future plans and to help shape our future organisation.

I have attended several function design workshops with staff from across all of our CCGs and Integrated Care System (ICS), to contribute to the development of the new ICB. In addition, I have been leading the workshops on population health with a wide range of stakeholders from our CCGs, ICS, Local Authorities, community organisations and NHS providers.

Joint Committee of CCGs

The Joint Committee of CCGs met in February to receive a progress update from the Change and Transition Board (as detailed above).

Ofsted and Care Quality Commission (CQC) System Inspection for SEND

Last week I attended the presentation session with colleagues from Sheffield City Council and Sheffield CCG to the CQC and Ofsted, which updated the regulatory organisations on the progress made to date for SEND services since the previous inspection back in 2018. At the time of writing this report, the inspection process was ongoing. We look forward to hearing back from the inspection teams on the significant work which Sheffield CCG and Sheffield City Council have undertaken in partnership to improve SEND services and support.

Locality Work

I continue to engage with the work of the West Locality of the CCG, working with our cluster of five PCNs, local GPs and practice managers. We continue collectively to work on developing a locality population health plan and responding to operational and strategic issues across the locality.

Overview and Scrutiny

I attended the Health and Care Overview and Scrutiny Committee at Sheffield City Council in January to appraise elected members of the changes set out in the Health and Care Bill and to explore the implications for Health and Care services in our city and across South Yorkshire.

Sheffield Health and Wellbeing Board

I continue to Co-chair the Sheffield Health and Wellbeing Board, which met in January and February for development and strategy sessions.

Joint Commissioning Committee with Sheffield City Council

I continue to Co-chair the Sheffield Joint Commissioning Committee with Sheffield City Council, which met in January and February for development sessions. The focus has been on monitoring our progress against the commissioning intentions we set out in April 2021. We have also been discussing the pending implementation of statutory Integrated Care Boards and the development of our Joint Commissioning Team to meet the structural changes and population health challenges in the future.
