

Urgent Care Workshop 11 June 2018

We asked people to work in groups on three exercises. Each table had a facilitator to help support the discussions and take notes.

Exercise 1: travel and transport / central location

Part 1

- Attendees were asked to look at a map of Sheffield and think about where they would consider to be 'central'. People were then asked to discuss their answer and the factors that made them feel it was central in their groups.

Part 2

- Groups were then asked to discuss what they considered to be a reasonable amount of time to travel for:
 - A. services in their local area (eg GP)
 - B. a city-wide service (eg hospital)

NB: People were asked to consider car, public transport and walking separately

Exercise 2: alternative proposals suggested in the consultation

In total, 17 alternative approaches were suggested in the consultation feedback. (These were included in the report on the feedback that was presented to NHS Sheffield's Primary Care Commissioning Committee in March – [click here for details](#)). Our initial consideration indicates that 7 of these approaches would not be possible to implement in the next 2-3 years because we already know there would not be enough staff available to deliver the services or it would cost more than the money available or it would not meet national guidance.

- Attendees were asked to discuss the other 10 suggestions in their groups, focusing on what they felt could be the pros and cons of each and access.

Exercise 3: options appraisal criteria

To assess the range of options we explored before consulting, we used a number of criteria. These were based on the objectives we set ourselves when we started this work and the feedback we had from people during the engagement work we did – [please click here for details](#). The criteria are given different 'weightings' so that some are more important than others.

- Attendees were asked to work in their groups to rate the 6 criteria in order of importance, with no 1 being the one they thought was most important.
